BACKGROUND

Many of you attended a Combined Public Meeting earlier at the Mirambeena Hotel. Many urgent issues of concern to the community were raised. Time beat us. We were unable to decide upon a what actions to use to deal with the issues and problems raised, and improve planning directed at supporting the needs of the community.

This situation has become even more urgent with the Northern Territory Government's infill and compact living policies. Now it is being said that the population of Greater Darwin will double in the planned future. Doubling the population means that we need better urban design, with shade, setbacks, and arcades consistent with walkability and tropical living. We must not destroy the local character of suburbs and rural area valued by our people.

Doubling the population means doubling our public community facilities and parks, and not continuing to allow the need to be ignored in favour of commercialization. Ensuring effective transport is important, as is a conscious response to greenhouse issues. Conserving the environment of our harbour, its foreshores, and our waterway catchments, for our social, cultural and healthy wellbeing, and for tourist benefit, is essential to our Top End life.
